## Rules for Exhibitors

1. Exhibitors must be paid up members of the Collins Bay and District Horticultural Society.
2. Cultural exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor for a minimum of **two months** prior to show time.
3. An exhibit entered in the wrong class, containing any material other than that specified, or containing the wrong number of specimens **will not be judged**. Buds showing colour will be counted as blooms.
4. Exhibitors are limited to one entry in each class.
5. Decorative arrangements or designs are to be created by the exhibitor.
6. Exhibits may not be awarded a prize, even if it is the only entry in its class unless the judge considers it to have sufficient merit.
7. Cultural entries are shown with attached foliage unless otherwise stated.
8. Decorative classes are to use at least some fresh plant material. Discreet use of painted or treated material is allowed. However, the use of artificial plant material is not allowed, except plastic grapes are permitted.
9. The decision of the judges shall be final. Any protest must be in writing and submitted to the Show Chair.
10. As judging will start at 7:30. please have your entries in by 7:00pm. You must supply your own classes for cultural classes, paper plates will be provided for vegetables & fruit.
11. Scoring: First 6 points, Second 4 points, Third 2 points
12. Best of Show – Judge's Choice – receives 10 points.

## Awards

**2005 Anniversary Award**-to the exhibitor with the highest aggregate of show points

**Etched Vase Award** – to the exhibitor with the most points in specimen flower classes of the shows (Sections A&B)

**The Eaton Cup Award** – to the exhibitor with the most points in the fruit and vegetable classes of the shows (Section C)

**The Simpson Sears 'Gold' Bowl Award** – most points in Fall Show

**Dahlia Trophy Award** – 1<sup>st</sup> in Dahlia class

## Division 1:

**Class: Flower arrangements;** Max table space 24" for each entry

1. **"Big, Bold & Beautiful"** – an interpretive design of flowers, vegetables and/or fruit in a basket
2. **"Nature's Gifts"** – creative design using water.
3. **"Second Time Around"** – design using repurposed materials
4. **"Afternoon Tea"** - a small design in a cup - not to exceed 10" in any direction, including base, container and accessories
5. **"Farewell to Summer"** – a miniature design not more than 5" in any direction.
